The Book

Designed as a reference work for the student and general reader, this Kabbalistic dictionary is a concise and handy guide to the history and treasures of the Jewish mystical tradition. It is the first dictionary of Kabbalah to provide an overview of the major themes of Jewish Kabbalistic thought as it developed over the centuries and also contains brief introductions to its major practitioners. In addition to the dictionary itself, the book contains a chronology of Kabbalah, a history of Kabbalah from ancient times to the present, maps, illustrations and an insight



into the emergence of the Kabbalah Centre in California, where many stars, including Madonna, worship.

The Author

Dan Cohn-Sherbok was born in Denver, Colorado, and was ordained a Reform rabbi at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, where he gained a doctorate in divinity. He has served as a rabbi in Melbourne, London and Johannesburg and received a doctorate in philosophy from Cambridge University. From 1975 he taught Jewish theology at the University of Kent, Canterbury, before taking up his current role as Professor of Judaism at the University of Wales at Lampeter. He is the author and editor of over 80 books which have been translated into Russian, Chinese, Bulgarian, French, Swedish, Italian, German, Greek, and Japanese.

The Book

A cat with wages paid four times a year; a bishop cursed by a witch; and a lady descended from a swan. These are a few of the delightful stories from Exeter Cathedral's past, unearthed by a lifetime of research into the cathedral and its archives by a distinguished scholar. We also learn of the man who arranged to have himself displayed as a decaying corpse; the storms, battles, and burnings of heretics that amazed the cathedral clergy in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries; and the problems of travelling to London in 1562.

The sixteen stories in the collection conclude with John Betjeman's mischievous visit to Exeter in the 1930s and the absent-minded bishop, Lord William Cecil, who allegedly telegraphed to his wife 'Am in Ilfracombe. Why?'

The Author

Nicholas Orme is well known for his clear and appealing writings and lectures on Exeter Cathedral and its history. The author of some twenty books, including a collection of stories for

children, he is a DLitt and DD of Oxford, Emeritus Professor of History at Exeter University, and an Honorary Canon of Truro Cathedral.
